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## Melbourne, Thursday, 9 November 2017


Hi, everybody!

With two final, post-festival events in Melbourne now behind us (a screening of Angel of the Lord 2 including a lively Q&A with director Jiří Strach, and a copresentation of TV mini-series Murder in Polná at the Jewish International Film Festival), the stalwart CaSFFA team can unwind and catch their breath a little over the summer months just ahead, before throwing themselves wholesale into plotting and staging next year's 6th festival. And oh! such exciting things as they have even already set in motion for 2018!

But first, it behooves us at this juncture to share with you a little recap of the festival that was #CaSFFA2017...





# In 2017 we hosted or co-presented a record 36 cinema sessions spanning:

- 5 months: from July 15 to November 1
- 3 cities: Brisbane, Melbourne, and Canberra
- 3 prestigious FIAF-affiliated venues: the Queensland Art Gallery & Gallery of Modern Art; the Australian Centre for the Moving Image (and not just for screenings, but also for our wonderful poster and art exhibitions), and the Arc Cinema at the National Film and Sound Archive with important cameos from the Federation Square Big Screen and the Classic Cinema in Elsternwick
- 2 partnerships with major film festivals: the Queensland Film Festival, and the Jewish International Film Festival
- 4 other essential program presentation partners: the Melbourne Cinémathèque, the Hungarian Consulate in Melbourne, the Czech Consulate in Sydney, and the University of Melbourne European Union Centre on Shared Complex Challenges
- 2 key filmmaker retrospectives: Juraj Herz, and Zoltán Fábri
- 1 in-person director Q&A: Jiří Strach
- 1 post-film panel: featuring guests Dr Ilona Hongisto and Dr Tyson Wils
- 3 exceptional parties! Opening & Closing Night in Melbourne, and Opening Night in Canberra

#### We also had:

- 318 attendees of our Closing Night film *Anthropoid* in Melbourne our biggest ever audience for a single session at ACMI!
  - Other audience hits: *The Cremator*; *Morgiana*; *The Line*; *Little Harbour*; *Beauty and the Beast*, and *Angel of the Lord 2*
- **4000 attendees overall**, another CaSFFA record!
- 2 joint winners of this year's Australian Film Critics Association Award: Filthy and Little Harbour – our congratulations to the producers of both films, such wonderful films both, and a joy and a privilege to share with Melbourne audiences!
